ELIGIBILITY FOR GOVERNMENT SEATS

NOTE:

- (i) No candidate shall be eligible for admission to Government Seats unless he is a citizen of India and satisfies any one of the following conditions:-
- (ii) Each condition is specified as a clause and is individually referred by a code. The documents to be produced during verification of documents in support of the claim for each of the Clauses are also detailed below the respective clauses.
- (iii) The candidates who do not satisfy any of the Clauses / Eligibility Criteria detailed below and the candidates who do not produce the prescribed documents in original will not be eligible for admission to professional courses under Government quota seats.
- (iv) Other than the certificate mentioned in clauses, if a candidate claiming seat under Article 371 (j) Hyderabad-Karnataka region reservation, candidate should produce eligibility certificate from the concerned Assistant Commissioner in Annexure-A as per the format.

ELIGIBILITY CLAUSES

The candidate should have studied and passed in one or more Government or Government recognized educational institutions located in the State of Karnataka for a minimum period of **SEVEN** academic years commencing from 1st standard to 2nd PUC / 12th standard as on 1st July of the year in which the Entrance Test is held and must have appeared and passed either SSLC / 10th standard or 2nd PUC / 12th standard examination from Karnataka State. In case of the candidate who had taken more than one year to pass a class or standard, the years of academic study is counted as one year only.

Documents to be produced:

- 1) SSLC / 10th standard Marks Card,
- 2) 2nd PUC / 12th standard Marks Card of the candidate,
- 3) Candidate's Study Certificate;
- 4) If claiming Rural quota: - Rural Study Certificate from 1st to 10th std for Ten Complete Years.
- 5) If claiming Kannada Medium quota: Kannada Medium Study Certificate from 1st to 10th std for Ten Complete Years;.
- 6) If claiming reservation benefits: Caste / Caste Income Certificate issued by Concerned Tahsildar- For SC / ST in Form-D, Category-I in form E and 2A, 2B, 3A and 3B in Form F.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Candidates from all over the country can appear for the UGET 2017 entrance examination. The eligibility criterion for various programs has been as published by COMEDK in its Notification dated 21.12.2016 on its website www.comedk.org which is reproduced as under:-

FOR UG ENGINEERING COURSES

-  The qualifying examinations prescribed for admission for B.E. is second PUC or 10+2 Higher Secondary or equivalent examination recognized by State / Central Government; the last two years of study shall comprise of Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics with English as a compulsory subject.
-  **The General Merit candidates should have passed with a minimum aggregate of 45% marks (40% in respect of SC, ST and OBC candidates of Karnataka State) in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics and should have**

passed these subjects individually. Physics and Mathematics are compulsory subjects along with Chemistry or Bio Technology or Biology or Computer Science or Electronics as one of the optional subjects. However, changes, if any, in the eligibility criteria by the AICTE will be adopted.

- An attempt in the COMEDK Entrance Test seeking admission to Engineering courses is considered adequate for figuring in the rank list.
- Diploma candidates are not eligible to take the Entrance Test as there are no lateral entry admissions.

Note: The candidates shall submit the original marks card of the examination during counseling for proving their eligibility vis-a-vis marks scored as evidenced by the original marks card

STATUS OF THE CANDIDATES

Candidates are classified as General Merit and Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe or Other Backward Classes (On Karnataka Basis) or those belonging to Tulu / /Christian minority communities and those belonging to Hyderabad-Karnataka (HK) Region; there is reservation for admissions to educational institutions for candidates who are 'local persons' for HK region as per Karnataka Government Order in No. DPAR 06 PLX 2012 dated 06.11.2013 which is available separately on the website and issued pursuant to Art.371J of the Indian Constitution. Though there is no reservation for any other categories permissible as of date, the classification is being followed for eligibility norms only.

a) Declaration once made in the application with regard to the category status like GM / SC / ST / OBC / Minority and H-K Region WILL NOT BE changed subsequently under any circumstances. The candidates are cautioned to fill in the application form with great care about the category status.

b) The candidates who have claimed category such as (SC/ST/OBC) of Karnataka should produce a valid certificate at the time of Counseling. If the certificates are not produced or not valid and if the candidates fall under 40% criteria for lower eligibility his / her rank will become invalid and he / she will not be allowed to participate in the counseling process.

c) The candidates who have claimed Minority / Hyderabad Karnataka status should produce a valid certificate at the time of first appearance in the Counseling. If the certificates are not produced or not valid then such of these candidates will not be entitled to select a seat under the reservation claimed.

d) Certificates for SC/ST/OBC/Minority and H-K Region, if applicable, should have been procured before the submission of Online Application.

e) If the category certificate is different and exclusive, such of the candidates shall submit not only the category certificate but also the caste and Income certificate issued by the competent authority in original at the time of counseling.

Management Quota

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

FOR UG ENGINEERING COURSES

- ❖ The qualifying examinations prescribed for admission for B.E. is second PUC or 10+2 Higher Secondary or equivalent examination recognized by State / Central Government; the last two years of study shall comprise of Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics with English as a compulsory subject.
- ❖ **The General Merit candidates should have passed with a minimum aggregate of 45% marks (40% in respect of SC, ST and OBC candidates of Karnataka State) in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics and should have passed these subjects individually. Physics and Mathematics are compulsory subjects along with Chemistry or Bio Technology or Biology or Computer Science or Electronics as one of the optional subjects. However, changes, if any, in the eligibility criteria by the VTU/DTE/AICTE will be adopted.**
- ❖ An attempt in the COMEDK or CET Entrance Test seeking admission to Engineering courses under the management quota is considered adequate for figuring in the rank list

Note: The candidates shall submit the original marks card of the examination at our management office, SDM Educational Society, Sattur, Dharwad for proving their eligibility vis-a-vis marks scored as evidenced by the original marks card

NRI Eligibility

As per the definition defined in The Karnataka Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Determination of Fee) Act, 2006 read with the Karnataka Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Determination of Fee) (Amendment) Act, 2017 and the Income Tax Act 1961 Section 115 C (e) & 6, i.e., “ Non Resident Indian” means an individual resident outside India who is a citizen of India or is a Person of Indian Origin and includes Persons of Indian Origin and Overseas Citizens of India.

a) Non Resident Indian candidate means, a candidate born to a parent of Indian Origin and residing outside the country and who have passed the qualifying equivalent examination outside India.

b) The candidate who passed qualifying examination outside India should have registered in Indian Medical Council.

For the purpose of verification e-document may be considered with regard to NRI sponsored certificate subject to submitting the original at the time of taking the admission.

Mandatory Documents required for NRI candidate:

a) Candidate’s parents resident certificate issued by the Embassy of that country complying with the Income Tax Rules / any other certificates to establish evidence that they are resident of that country / affidavit on Rs.100/- e-stamp paper to that effect.

b) Candidate’s passport / VISA / Resident VISA.

c) Citizenship of the candidate.

d) Income Tax Documents required as per the Income Tax Act 1961.

e) Candidate’s study certificate for having studied outside India where applicable for the qualifying examination.

Mandatory Documents required for NRI sponsored candidate

a) NRI sponsorer’s resident certificate issued by the Embassy of that country complying

the Income Tax Rules / any other certificates to establish evidence that they are resident of that country / affidavit on Rs.100/- e-stamp paper to that effect.

b) NRI sponsorer’s passport / VISA/ Resident VISA (e-document any of these attested by competent authority.)

c) Citizenship of the NRI sponsorer

d) PAN/Tax document of the NRI sponsorer

e) Affidavit from the **candidate** (e-document – Annexure IV)

LATERAL ENTRY to III SEMESTER for Diploma / B.Sc. students

- (i) No candidate shall be eligible for admission to Government Seats unless he is a citizen of India and satisfies any one of the eligibility conditions:-
- (ii) Each condition is specified as a clause and is individually referred by a code. The documents to be produced during verification of documents in support of the claim for each of the Clauses are also detailed below the respective clauses.
- (iii) The candidates who do not satisfy any of the Clauses / Eligibility Criteria detailed below and the candidates who do not produce the prescribed documents in original will not be eligible for admission to professional courses under Government quota seats
- (iv) Other than the certificate mentioned in clauses, if a candidate claiming seat under Article 371 (j) Hyderabad-Karnataka region reservation, candidate should produce eligibility certificate from the concerned Assistant Commissioner in Annexure-A as per the format.

WHO CAN APPLY? ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY

a) For B.E Courses:

(Day Engineering College): A candidate who has passed any diploma examination or equivalent examination and obtained an aggregate minimum of 45% marks taken together in all the subjects of the final year (Fifth and sixth semester) diploma / B.Sc. Examination (Q.E) is eligible for admission to B.E courses, and 40% of marks in Q. E. in case of SC, ST and Backward Classes of Karnataka candidates.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS RELATED TO POST GRADUATE COMMON ENTRANCE TEST – 2017 AND SEAT ALLOTMENT PROCESS.

PRECEDING TO ENTRANCE TEST

1. The information / particulars furnished by the candidates in their 'PGCET-2017' online application form are FINAL for admissions to MBA and M.Tech courses for the year 2017-18
2. Before claiming eligibility for Government seats, make sure that you satisfy any one of the eligibility clauses detailed in Item – 6 of Chapter – I of the brochure. The candidates who do not satisfy any one of the eligibility clauses will not be eligible for admission to Government seats.
3. If the information submitted by the candidates in the online application form or any other document submitted by the candidate / parents are found to be false / incorrect, such candidate's seat will be cancelled at any point of time during his / her course of study and criminal proceedings will be initiated by the Government against such candidate as per Rules.

DURING THE ENTRANCE TEST

1. The Post Graduate Common Entrance Test for admissions to MBA, MCA and M.E. / M.Tech / M.Arch courses will be held as per the schedule notified.
2. The candidates must appear for Post Graduate Common Entrance Test for admission to MBA/ M. Tech courses as per the schedule notified by the Karnataka Examinations Authority.
3. The candidates should read the instructions printed on the OMR answer sheet before answering. The candidates have to mark the correct answers on the OMR answer sheet using BLUE OR BLACK INK BALL POINT PEN ONLY.
4. After completion of the test, the candidates must affix their LEFT HAND THUMB IMPRESSION in the space provided on the bottom portion of OMR answer sheet before handing over the same to the room invigilator.
5. After completion of the test, the candidates will be allowed to carry replica of the filled OMR answer sheet. Such replicas should be preserved for a period of one year.
6. THERE WILL BE NO NEGATIVE MARKING IN RESPECT OF WRONG ANSWERS BUT MARKS WILL NOT BE AWARDED IN RESPECT OF MORE THAN ONE ANSWER INDICATED AGAINST A QUESTION BY A CANDIDATE ON THE OMR ANSWER SHEET.

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AFTER ENTRANCE TEST

1. The ANSWER KEY will be published within three days after the completion of the entrance test on the KEA website. The candidates / parents / lecturers, can file their objections, if any, within three days in respect of any of the published answer key, along with all the supporting documents & justification. Objections filed by the candidates without justification shall not be considered. Objections received after the last date fixed shall not be considered. Objections received by the KEA will be placed before an Expert Committee, whose decision will be final in this regard.

2. The merit list will be prepared separately for MBA, / M.Tech solely on the basis of the marks obtained in the Post Graduate Common Entrance Test without taking the marks obtained by the candidates in the qualifying examination. The qualifying examination marks is considered only for eligibility. Therefore, the candidates are advised to attend the counseling only if they have the requisite percentage of marks in the qualifying examination. (i.e., should have obtained 50% of aggregate minimum marks taken together in all the subjects for all the years of the Degree examination. 45% of aggregate marks in all the subjects for all the years in the Degree examination in case of candidates belonging to SC, ST and Category-I. Further, only the candidates of Karnataka origin will be eligible to claim reservation). Therefore, mere assignment of merit / a rank to a candidate does not confer any right to select a seat.
3. All the candidates (GM, SC, ST Category – I and OBC category candidates) must compulsorily produce the STUDY CERTIFICATE obtained from the heads of the institutions where the candidates have passed the 10th standard / SSLC examination / PUC / Degree Examination, by mentioning the Standards, Academic years as per the admission register of the institution. (Refer Appendix for study certificate proforma)
4. Candidates belonging to reserved categories should submit caste / income certificate as the case may be, issued by the Tahasildar in Form 'D' for SC, ST, in Form 'E' for Category-I and in Form 'F' for 2A, 2B, 3A and 3B categories.
5. Please read the refund and forfeiture conditions detailed in this brochure carefully.
6. KEA will publish on its website all the details of candidates who have selected seats under reserved category for MBA, MCA, ME / M.Tech / M.Arch courses, such as candidate's name, father's name, category under which seat selected, annual income of the parent etc., after the last round
7. If a candidate does not surrender the seat to KEA during casual vacancy seat selection round on or before his / her turn comes, he / she deemed to have got admitted to the seat selected by him / her.
8. If a candidate decides to surrender his / her seat, he / she has to surrender the seat only to KEA. Merely not reporting to the selected college should not be presumed by the candidate that he / she has surrendered the seat to KEA.

NOTE:

1. *All the admissions and undergraduate Degrees to claim eligibility for admission to any of the PG courses is subject to approval of the Government / VTU / other respective University.*
2. *As per the letter from VTU, Belgaum dated 12-08-2014, to pursue M.Tech course on the basis of undergraduate programme from Aeronautical Society of India is **NOT** approved.*
3. *As per the letter from VTU, Belgaum dated 30-05-2014, who have acquired B.E. Degree through Distance Education Mode are **NOT** eligible for admission to M.Tech Courses.*
