





INTRODUCTION

To address these issues, it is necessary to promote rural development in accordance with Gandhi's vision of self-sufficient 'village republics,' based onlocal resources and employing decentralized, environmentally friendly technologies, so that basic needs such as food, clothing, shelter, sanitation, health care, energy, livelihood, transportation, and education are met on a local level.

The students of Electronics and Communication department of SDMCET visited a village named Harobelavadi which is one of the adopted villages from our institution SDMCET Dharwad as "Adarsha Grama" under "Unnat Bharat Abhiyan" on 16/11/2021 as a part of our AICTE activity. This activity was held with the intention of creating awareness among the people of locality which included school interaction, cleaning the surrounding area and gram panchayat survey. Total of 29 members were a part of this visit including one faculty coordinator.



These 29 members were divided into 5 sub-teams to perform various activities such as Village Survey, Cleaning, School Interaction and some awareness programs at village as wellas school levels. Each activity was supervised and monitored by the coordinators.

Harobelavadi village is located in Dharwad district in Karnataka, India. It is situated 22km away from Dharwad. As per 2009 stats, Harobelavadi is the gram panchayat of Harobelavadi village. The total geographical area of village is 2223.75 hectares. Harobelavadi has a total population of 2957 peoples. There are about 500 houses in Harobelavadi village.

As a part of school interaction Sarkari Hiriya Prathamika Shale Harobelawadi was visited. This school was built in the year 1940 and named as Kanarese Boy's School by K. F. Patil. B.A. (Chairman D.S.B. Dharwar). Later it was named as Sarkari Hiriya Prathamika Shale Harobelawadi.

- School has classes from 1-8.
- There are 241 students in total out of which 135 are girls and 106 are boys.
- There are 12 classrooms in this school.
- There are 9 teachers including 8 female faculty and 1 male faculty.
- This school has a playground, toilets with good hygiene and purified water supply.
- Milk will be provided daily to the students as a part of "Ksheera Bhagya Yojana"
- Lunch known as "Bisi-Uta" at afternoon by ISKON- Akshaya Patra Foundation as a part of Mid-Day meal program.

SURVEY ACTIVITY

The activity was conducted in order to check the number of people vaccinated and to inspect the basic needs available to them. Along with this an attempt was made to create COVID safety awareness among the people of the village and give them an exposure to the technological aspects in their known field of occupation.

- 3. Total number of members in the house with number of children.
- 4. Type of domestic animals raised and their count.
- 5. Availability of basic facilities like water and electricity and also the sewage system.
- 6. Vaccination status of each member of the house.

We also came across some facilities that are being provided by the government such as:

- 1. The government is providing Ration to those who have BPL cards.
- 2. Girl child is availing Bhagya Lakshmi Yojana.
- 3. All kids are getting proper education.
- 4. Most of the people are double vaccinated.

This survey included collecting information about the issues faced by village people. Through this survey we encountered some problems faced by the villagers those problems are as follows:

- 1. **Health issues**: There are no hospitals in the village. To consult doctor they need to travel for 7-8 kms which is problematic for them during emergency and in night time. Due to this they had to spend a lot of money during Chikungunya outbreak.
- 2. **Transport system**: The roads were muddy and damaged. Also there are no direct roads from farms to their home because of which they couldn't bring crop(corn) to their home, during floods last year. So they have undergone heavy loss.

- 3. **Crop market**: The expenditure they spend on growing crop is more than the profit they gain from it. So they had to change the crop from corn to chick peas. This is in turn leading to less cultivation of corn and many other crops.
- 4. **Lack of digitalization**: Only very few of the families are using online payment methods. That too only youngster (at max. single person from the family).

Brief of the activity:

The activity which we had to undergo was to make a survey of the village named Kabbenur, the objective of the survey was to know whether the village had proper water and sanitary facilities including the number of domestic animals they own, the importance of this was to know whether people were receiving proper facilities and keep a count of domestic animals they owned. This activity was assigned by the Gram panchayath on 16/11/2021 (Tuesday) under a program called *UNNATH BHARAT ABHIYAN*.

We divided ourselves into two teams with four members in each team and visited several homes (40 homes) collected data from the people of village. Almost every house we visited had domestic animals and were receiving proper facilities from the government.

Every villager treated us respectfully and gave us proper data. But we even got to observe at one end of the village they didn't have proper sanitary facilities which we have reported in the survey sheet. Throughout the activity we observed most of the families happy about the facilities received and few are waiting for the constructions of the Toilets.

This activity helped us in understanding the people of our rural region and their problems as we had a chance to communicate with them. We even had chance to communicate with the students of Government school, Kabbenur which again gave us great pleasure. We hope this activity was successful and helped Gram panchayath in knowing the progress of the village. We would like to thank our college SDMCET and the Gram Panchayath, Kabbenur for giving us this opportunity to interact and have a learning experience through this activity.
